Aromatic Amino Acid Decarboxylase Deficiency (AADC); a genetically inherited neurological disorder affecting the brains ability to produce neurotransmitters, dopamine and serotonin. Affected children can show a number of movement disorders, most frequently dystonia (a neurological movement disorder, in which sustained muscle contractions cause twisting and repetitive movements or abnormal postures). The severity of symptoms experienced by each affected child varies, but the majority of children show minimal motor development in the absence of treatment.
